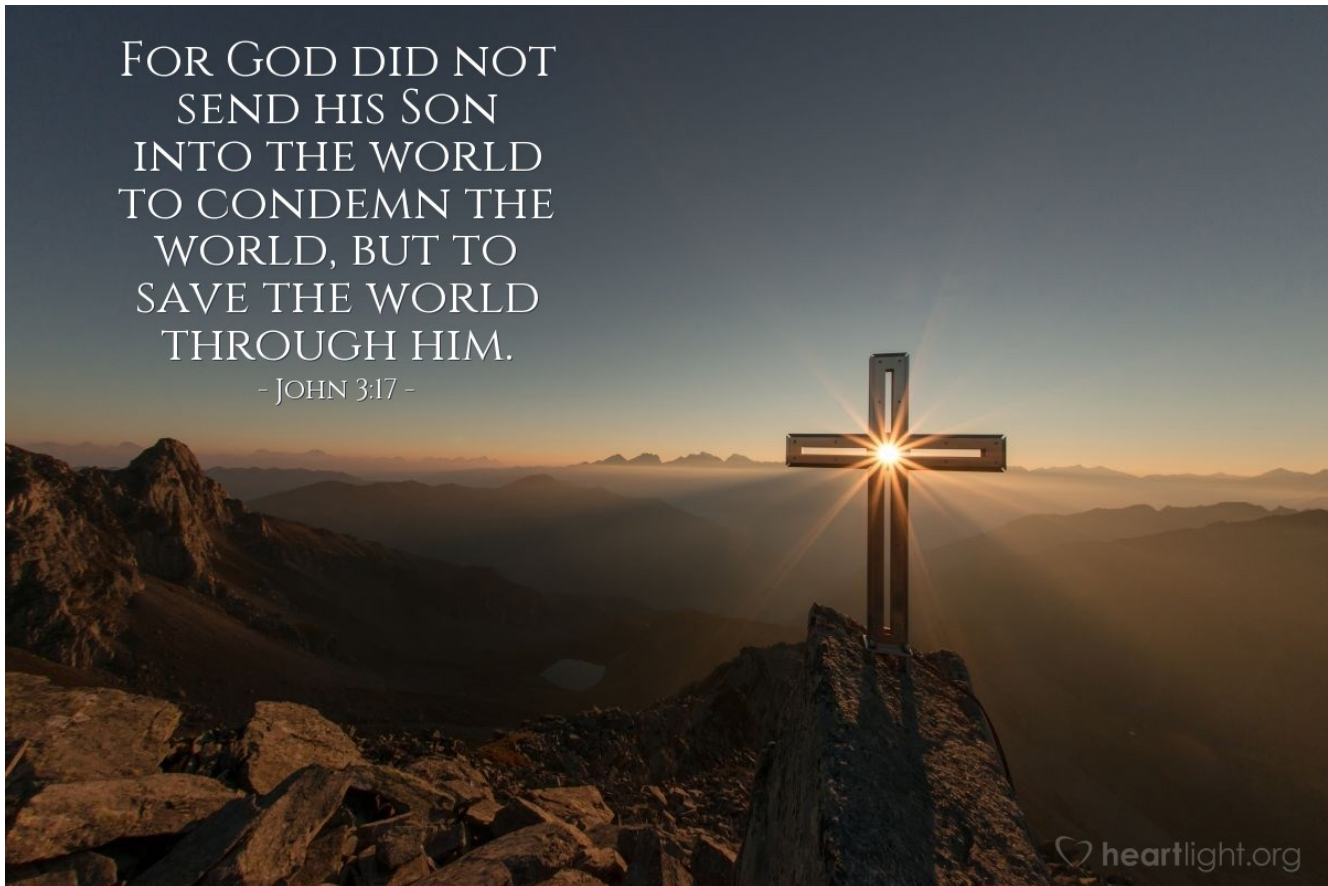

Don't touch the slimy walls!

The Parish Life committee sponsored a bus trip to Rochester to cruise down the Erie Canal. The group started the adventure with a buffet lunch in the sunshine overlooking the Genesee River at the Rabbit Hole Tavern. After lunch, Rochester by Water's "Riverie" (combination of River and Erie) boat began to cruise smoothly through the river and down to the Erie Canal. A beautiful day for a cruise, the passengers all had a wonderful time looking at all the sights along the river bank. After a beautiful ride down the canal, the Riverie arrived at Lock 33 in Henrietta, NY. There the boat entered the lock and water was slowly pumped out so that it would match the water on the far side of the canal so the cruise could continue. The boat was lowered 25.4FT from where it had started. Once the boat was tied to the wall of the lock, the Captain announced very clear instructions: "DON'T TOUCH THE SLIMY WALLS!" Once the boat was lowered, the far doors were open and the cruise was able to continue. Once through the lock, the boat turned around and once again entered the lock. This time 2.9 million gallons of water were slowly pumped back in and the boat rose back up to the original 512.9FT. St Medard (Patron Saint of weather) came through with an amazingly sunny, warm, glorious day! One last stop at Leo's deli for Dutch apple pie and then back to Elmira. Everyone had an excellent time seeing Rochester from the Genesee River and the Erie Canal along side new and old friends. We hope you can join us on the next Parish Life excursion!

Venturing Outward in Love: Acting on Pope Leo's Apostolic Exhortation, *Dilexi Te*

Pope Leo focuses on the poor, on the millions living lives unworthy of their intrinsic human dignity because of global economic systems perpetuated by the wealthy and powerful. He decries the gap between the rich and poor, the staggering inequality that shields the wealthy from even noticing the conditions of life faced by the poor, the growth of a wealthy elite living in a bubble of comfort and luxury...almost in another world compared to ordinary people. Pope Leo calls us to unite our love and care for the earth with love for the poor. **Living Faith:** Learn about the global trash/waste crisis...where does our trash end up? (hint: often in the oceans and in poor countries). Decide to reduce, reuse, recycle more to reduce your own trash. *from reflection by Daniel P. Scheid, Professor of Moral Theology at Boston College.

Many years ago Father James Bloomer was Pastor of St. Patrick's Parish in Elmira. He established the Father Bloomer Scholarship Fund to help young people with their college expenses. There are conditions that must be met in order to be awarded a share of this scholarship money.

1. The student must attend a Catholic college or University.
2. The student must be a member of the parish and request an application from the parish office.
3. The student must indicate on the application that they have been ACTIVE in their church, school AND community by citing areas where they have and are taking part in volunteer services.
